GRANTS RECEIVED BY PROAID CLIENTS

Our clients have received numerous grants from a variety of funders and donors through the services and assistance of ProAid Ltd. These grants have helped these organisations implement important projects and enact lasting positive change in their community. Some of these include:

- **360 Community Trust** received funding from Department of Internal Affairs and the Ministry of Social Development for sports, arts, youth mentoring and operating costs totalling \$25,000.
- Aotearoa Mustard Seed Ministries Charitable Trust received grants from the Department of Internal Affairs and Ministry of Social Development - \$25,000 for Projects addressing Maori youth and operating costs
- Malwa Sports Club received a \$10,000 grant from Lion Foundation to implement a sports tournament for over 200 participants.
- **Sikh Society of Auckland** received a start up grant to set up a computer and literacy centre for migrant youth and adults in Auckland.
- **Somali Women's Incorporated Society** received grants of \$105,000 from ASB Community Trust, DIA, MSD and the Auckland Council for arts and culture projects for youth, social enterprise projects for migrant and refugee women and for operating costs.
- International Development NGO's- Over \$2Million to implement a sustainable Agriculture project in Cooks Islands and community development projects in Samoa, Nepal, Vietnam, Cambodia, Somalia and Mongolia.

Pacific Regional Grant Alert and Tender Opportunities!!

- Global Environment Facility GEF: Eligible projects are classified as Full-Sized (USD 1 million or more) and Medium-Sized (up to USD 1 million). Both types of projects can be financed to NGOs; communities; Civil Society Organizations.
- French Fund French territories as well as Fiji, Nairu, Tuvalu and Tonga 300,000 euro per project.
- UN Pacific- provides programme close to \$14mill USD to 10 Pacific Island Countries. The Fiji Multi Country Office (MCO) collaborates with civil society organizations in the projects implementation and/or policy dialogue processes.
- GIZ- A five country programme for marine and ecosystem with a total funding contribution of 8\$mill euro over 5 years, deforestation and degradation in Vanuatu/SI and PNG with a total of 4.9mill euros and 19.2 mill euros for a 12 country wide approach to climate change.
- ADB- PNG-\$49 mill to rural primary health services delivery. 2. Solomon Islands \$5 mill to economic recovery support programme, \$4 mill for second road improvement programme. 3. Timor Leste \$11 mill for district capital water supply, \$12 mill for mid-level skills training. 4. Vanuatu -\$12.6 mill for interisland shipping support and 31 mills for Port villa urban development. Total grants made to the rest of the pacific are \$35.1 mill in grants.
- NZ-AID Pacific region distributes \$5mill per year to smaller projects at local country office level which is accessible to NGO's/CSO's
- AusAID \$16 mill DRR programme for four countries in the Pacific
